

Application for Microfunding

Microfunding allotments of up to \$7,500 are available for MSES + MDSA engagement projects. The next round of proposals will be reviewed in Spring of 2024 but applications can be submitted throughout the year.

Projects should align with MSES & MDSA's strategic priorities (listed below) or address opportunities to increase awareness of diversity, equity and inclusion. All projects must adhere to Facility Engagement (FE) MOU guidelines and should ideally engage multiple MSES & MDSA members, within or across disciplines or centres.

All projects must be completed by March 31, 2025. There will be no extension of funding. If it appears that projects will take more than one fiscal year to complete, applicants are encouraged to consider applying in future rounds.

To be considered, applications must include the following in a one-page proposal:

- 1) Project Title
- 2) Project Leads and an Executive Sponsor (at RMD level or higher)
- 3) Project Description: (max 250 words)
 - a. Justification and Methods
 - b. Include who will be involved in this project: MDSA members, disciplines, centres, leadership
- 4) Project Impact: (max 250 words)
 - a. What beneficial outcome(s) do you anticipate?
 - b. How will you know if success has been achieved?
- 5) How does this project align with MDSA/MSES Strategic Goals? (Max 250 words)
- 6) Project Timelines
- 7) Project Budget
